



## Weekly Timetable of Activities

Please see the details below of how to log in to each of the websites.


If you are not sure which level your child should be reading please contact your child's class teacher via Purple Mash.

**Additional ideas you might like to try:**

Make a Bottle Filter – You can make muddy water run clear. It does not kill bacteria so **DO NOT DRINK IT.**

1. Cut the bottom off a plastic bottle and remove the lid.
2. Put a piece of cloth in the neck of the bottle.
3. Add a layer of charcoal or sand.
4. Add a layer of gravel.
5. Add a layer of grass and leaves.
6. Add a layer of wood shavings.
7. Make sure everything is compacted down.
8. Pour your muddy water through the bottle filter into another container.
9. Pass it through the filter several times until it runs clear.





## Independent activities





#### My Phase 3 Sound Mat


