Taking Care of a Dog


Dogs are a very popular pet to have. It is estimated that there are over 8 million in the United Kingdom.

Dogs can be great pets if they are cared for correctly.


Taking Care of a Dog

What Does a Dog Need?

Owners must also ensure their dog has a comfortable place to sleep. Exercise is vital to help dogs stay healthy and daily walks are essential. Always ensure your dog stays safe by keeping them on a lead in public places.

What Are Baby Dogs Called?

Baby dogs are called puppies and they are born in a litter. This means that three, four or more puppies are born at one time. From birth, they drink milk from their mum. They have to be about four weeks old before they start to eat solid food.
