# Important!

I have written my setting description in first person. This is because it helped me imagine I was really on the other planet. You do not have to write in first person, but if you do choose to, remember that you are not writing a narrative!

- Do not use speech
- Do not describe what you are doing/feeling in detail
- Focus on your surroundings and describe the environment you are in



- 1. Capital letters at the beginning of ALL sentences
- 2. Capital letters for ALL proper nouns (names and places)

No misplaced capital letters
(common nouns, random capital letters within words)

4. Closing punctuation at the end of all sentences

5. Commas for lists

6. Commas for fronted adverbials

7. Apostrophes for contractions, without a join

8. Legible, joined handwriting

The four Joins

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- herizontal principal for letters with assert
