## Christmas

This week we looked at the Christmas story in more detail. We shared with the children that the Nativity story and took some time to think about the gifts that the Wisemen gave to Jesus and thought of gifts we would give to a special baby. The children were really thoughtful and suggested gifts like a "a dummy" to help the baby calm down when they were sad and "a hat" to keep them warm and "toys" for them to play with.

In our Understanding of the world we conducted an investigation to explore 'melting'. We talked about the different ways we could melt the chocolate to make our krispie cakes and the children suggested putting the chocolate in the sun, in the oven and even using the heat from our hands after a whole class discussion!
