(Don't forget to leave space for the other topics this year)</p>	<p><u>What would you wear?</u> What would you need to wear if you went on a trip to the rainforest? Draw and label a picture.</p>	<p><u>Rainforest Homes</u> Find out about people who live in the rainforest. What are their lives like? How is it different to where you live?</p>	<p><u>Where in the world?</u> Can you create a map of the rainforests around the world? What do you notice about where they are?</p>	<p><u>Famous Explorers</u> Research some famous explorers. What did they find? What makes them famous? Can you write a mini-biography about one of them?</p>
<p><u>Rainforest Collage</u> Use different materials to create a colourful rainforest collage. If it's too bumpy for your book you could take a picture and upload it to Purple Mash.</p>	<p><u>Design a Rainforest plant</u> Draw and label a plant that would be able to survive in the rainforest. What do plants need to survive? What would the life cycle of your plant look like? Seeds, seed dispersal growing, flowers?</p>	<p><u>Amazing Animals</u> Can you make a model of a rainforest animal? Is it a real animal or an imaginary one? How would these differ?</p>	<p><u>Rainforest Habitat</u> Which animals would live in a rainforest habitat? How are they suited to live there? Which parts of the rainforest do they live in?</p>	<p><u>Acrostic Poem</u> Write an acrostic poem about the rainforest.</p>
<p><u>Look at the Leaves</u> Collect some leaves from your garden or the park. How are they the same and different to leaves you might find in the rainforest? Why?</p>	<p><u>Healthy meals</u> Can you create a healthy meal? You could make it or just draw a picture of what you would like on your plate. What makes it healthy?</p>	<p><u>What do they eat?</u> Choose 3 rainforest animals and find out what they eat. Can you draw a food chain for one of the animals?</p>	<p><u>Beautiful Butterflies</u> Design a butterfly with symmetrical wings.</p>	<p><u>A letter from the Rainforest</u> Imagine you are exploring in the rainforest. Write a letter home all about your adventures.</p>
<p><u>Rainforest maths</u> 1.Create a repeating pattern of rainforest animals. 2. Work out how many legs are in your pattern. 3. Can you make a different pattern with the same number of legs?</p>	<p><u>Where from?</u> Can you find out about food or items that we use in our lives that actually come from the rainforests? Eg chocolate, coffee, avocados, some medicines...</p>	<p><u>Vehicles</u> Use junk modelling or Lego to design and build a vehicle that would be suitable to travel in the rainforest. What special adaptations might it need?</p>	<p><u>Make some rainforest music</u> What sounds might you hear in a rainforest? Can you use your body or some instruments to create a piece of music – record it and upload to Purple Mash for us to listen to.</p>	<p><u>Rain forest in a box</u> Use your art and design skills to make a rainforest in a box, don't forget to add lots of different plants and hidden animals.</p>
