LO. To write a descriptive passage about a fantasy land.

Today you are going to write a couple of descriptive paragraphs describing:

- a. the land through your portal
- b. a person you meet what they look like

Before you start writing, you must have a clear picture in your head of your fantasy land and fantasy character. Jot down ideas below in note form.

What does your fantasy land inside the tree look like?

Who do you see or meet? Jot down adjectives to describe what they look like.

Before you start writing, think of a good sentence opener to catch your reader's attention. Make them sit up and listen – hook them in.

When you close off your final paragraph, how are you going to keep your reader thinking? Could you use speech between characters or a rhetorical question?
